



RADON TESTING PROGRAM

POLICY:

The only way to know if a home has an elevated level of radon is to test, regardless of location.

The purpose of this policy is to outline the process for education about what radon is, dangers related to radon, radon testing and radon mitigation process.

PROCEDURE:

1. PUBLIC EDUCATION

- 1a. Current, credible and accurate information will be distributed through the SCCR office to alert the community about Radon.

2. APPLICATION PROCESS:

- Individuals expressing interest in testing for Radon in their home are encouraged to purchase a testing kit locally and follow the instructions enclosed with the kit. Lab processing costs will be reimbursed by SCCR on presentation of a receipt for lab testing.

3. REMEDIAL MEASURES:

- Remedial measures should be undertaken in a dwelling whenever the average annual radon concentration exceeds 200 Bq/m³ in the normal occupancy area.
- Information on financial assistance from Manitoba Hydro can be obtained through the Manitoba Hydro website.
